

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# Local Indicators

# Basic Conditions at School

- 89.7% of SLUSD teachers are fully credentialed and properly assigned, compared to 83.1% statewide.\*
- Only 4.6 teachers misassigned.\*
- All school **facilities** were rated “Exemplary” on the Facility Inspection Tool.
- All students had access to all standards-aligned instructional materials.

# Implementation of State Academic Standards

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- Ranked as “Full Implementation” of all state subsections
  - Improved student access and teacher professional learning in all curricular areas
  - Social science and history implementation slightly behind other core subjects
  - COVID - 19 reduced some professional learning offerings.
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# Parent Engagement

- Ranked as “Full Implementation” of all state subsections
- Communication and Engagement in advisory committees is a strength of SLUSD
- Seeking opportunities to further coordinate site and district efforts to engage families, particularly regarding academic awareness.






# School Climate

- California Healthy Kids Survey was administered to 301 5th grade students, 1257 middle school students (grades 7 -8), and 1127 high school students (grades 9-11).
- Additionally, 1,438 parents/guardians completed the California School Parent Survey (CSPS)
- 514 SLUSD Staff members completed the California School Staff Survey (CSSS).
- School engagement is highest in elementary grades
- Social emotional wellbeing is an area for future attention
- Indicators of bullying decrease from middle to high school



# Access to a Broad Course of Study

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- All elementary students have access to board-approved and standards-aligned course materials, as well as art and physical education
  - All high school core subject courses are UC a-g approved
  - 46 SLHS courses are Career Technical Education
  - 21 Advanced Placement Classes
